For a fire on the east side of the Coast Fork river and south of Main street the alarm shall be one stroke of the fire bell repeated at intervals.

For a fire on the east side and north of Main street the alarm shall be two strokes of the bell repeated at intervals.

For a fire on the west side and south of Wall street, the alarm shall be three strokes of the bell repeated.

For a fire on the west side and north of Wall street, the alarm shall be four strokes of the bell repeated. Cut this out and pin it on the wall for reference.

Water is very scarce, owners have been compelled to operate only a part of the stamp mill for several weeks.
