Water Power in Oregon.

In a recent issue we published an article with regard to the tremendous water power to be obtained from Niagara Falls, and showing the extent to which electrical energy in that region has supplanted other forms of power, says Oregon Mining Journal, Niagara Falls is naturally looked upon as the grandest demonstration of the possibilities of applied water power, but if a person will turn his thoughts to the natural conditions and resources of Oregon he will realize that here in our own state there is promise and opportunity for electrical generation and transmission far beyond that of Niagara. Discussing this subject editorially the Evening Telegram says: How much more inviting Oregon power appears from casual study. At the Willamette Falls there is a total of 59,000 horse-power available, of which the Portland General is using but about 13,000. A year ago E. H. McAlister, dean of the engineering department of the University of Oregon, surveyed and measured the McKenzie river for 40 miles, above its confluence with the Willamette, and found it had an available energy of 230,000 horse-power in that distance. The fall in 40 miles is 550 feet, while the volume of the stream varies from 3,497 cubic feet per second at Hayden's bridge to 2,181 cubic feet per second at the point where the survey began. The Lucky Boy mine secures a fall of 22 feet in less than a mile, and has installed a plant capable of generating 500 horse-power at less than \$50 per horse-power. A large plant would be less proportionately, and such plants could be erected every mile or two down the river, each one with a capacity of 10,000 horse-power or slightly more. Rogue river for a distance of perhaps 50 miles has a greater volume with as good power sites, and might be estimated as offering more than a total of 300,000 horse-power. The Santiam, Umpqua, Klamath, Coos, Des Chutes, John Day, Snake, Eagle and many other streams offer immense power. At The Dalles and Celilo the lordly Columbia pours its myra-

ulous flood down a slope of 40 feet keeping within 100 miles of Portland a reserve of energy that rivals Niagara.

"In an age when water power and electric transmission have become such vital industrial factors, these resources of Oregon, which compare magnificently with the nation's most landed site, are features of state wealth that must command more and more attention."

Interest in the Fair.

"People generally in the East are taking a greater interest in the Lewis and Clark Fair, to be held in Portland next year, than they are in the St. Louis show," said State Senator Warren W. Tolman, who returned recently from St. Louis where he attended a meeting of the Washington Fair Commission.

"All worlds fair are more or less alike, some of course being greater and some smaller, but any person who has visited one can form a pretty good general idea of what another will be like. For this reason, many people who visited Chicago in 1893, Buffalo in 1901, and other like exhibitions at different times and places, have not gone to St. Louis, but are waiting to come to the Pacific Coast next year. While the Fair here may not be so large and comprehensive, yet the reduced rates will give them an opportunity to visit and see for themselves what nature has done for this country, and that is a matter of very keen interest to every person who has not visited the Pacific slope.

"I visited for several days in Nebraska, and found but two of my old acquaintances there who had visited St. Louis, while not less than 30 others told me that they were already planning and saving their money to visit Portland next year, and will come or go through Spokane.

"I think I may say for our commission that we began with a well-matured plan, and have carried that plan out to a successful termination in every particular so

far, at the least expense to the tax-payers. The St. Louis exhibit will be returned to this state in good shape, ready for the Portland Fair, without a dollar of deficit."—Spokane Spokesman-Review, Oct. 25.

Improvements at the Mines.

The River side group of claims is located on Horse Heaven creek and has a tunnel at the present time in a distance of nearly 700 feet. From near the mouth of the tunnel, ore has been encountered to the breast, the most of the way the vein being wider than the tunnel. The ore thus far encountered is partially oxidized but carries a heavy percentage of galena. The showing at this property is so satisfactory to the Company that it has been decided to continue its development.

Recently manager F. J. Hard let a contract to Alex Lundberg for 500 feet more on the main tunnel which will make, when completed a total length of nearly 1200 feet, not more than a fourth of the distance this company owns, ahead up the mountain and as the ground rises very rapidly great depth will be gained as the work progresses.

OREGON COLORADO

A contract has also been let on the Oregon Colorado by manager Hard to Otherson and Anderson for 500 feet in the main working tunnel, which has already been driven some 800 feet. This vein which is being followed into the mountain carries a larger percentage of copper with good values in gold and silver. Work by the contractors will begin at once and continue until completion.

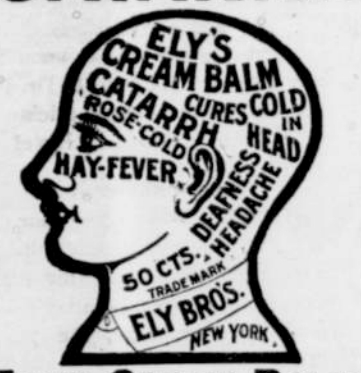
