**A New Flower.**

Luther Burbank has succeeded in creating a beautiful everlasting flower, which he considers his greatest achievement in the floral line. It is an ever-blooming flower, one that, after it has been plucked will remain radiant for all time winter and summer alike.

There is a bouquet of these flowers in Burbank's library on Santa Rosa avenue. The flowers were plucked in the Burbank garden a year ago and their blossoms have kept as bright and fresh as if just plucked from the plant. Burbank evolved the flower after careful crossing, re-crossing and selection from a hardy annual discovered in west central Australia. He has named it the "Australian star" flower.

The fragrance of the flower is peculiarly pleasing, the color a rose crimson shade, sometimes approaching pure white. The flowers form in large, graceful clusters, which will retain their form and color in perfection permanently, no other flower in any way equaling it in grace and keeping qualities. Full-grown plants are about one foot high and the same across. No water is required to keep the flower fresh.

"Two Little Waifs," one of Mr. Lincoln J. Carter's best productions will hold the boards at the opera house on Monday evening, Jan. 9th.

**NEW PLUMBING AND SEWER ORDINANCE**

Details of Provisions for Making Connections to Sewers and Materials Required.

Following is a full text of the new sewer ordinance, No. 95, which is published by order of the City Council:

**ORDINANCE NO. 95.**

An Ordinance entitled an "Ordinance to govern and regulate the construction and maintenance and connections of sewers and plumbing in the city of Cottage Grove; to license plumbers and sewer builders, to appoint a sewer committee, a plumbing inspector and to provide penalties for a violation of the provisions of said ordinance.

The common council of the City of Cottage Grove does ordain:—  
Section 1. No person shall make, alter or repair any connection with the sewer or water mains of the city of Cottage Grove, without having first obtained a license from the common council of said city to do such work. Application for such license shall be made to the city council in writing and no such license shall be granted except to persons having experience in plumbing and sewer building, evidence of which shall be furnished to the city council or its duly authorized committee before such license shall be granted. Such license shall be issued by the city recorder upon order of the common council in the same manner that other city licenses are granted and said recorder shall be entitled to a fee of \$1 for issuing such license, which shall not for a greater term than one year.

Sec. 2. Before any such license shall be issued, the person making application for the same shall execute and deposit with the city recorder a bond in the sum of \$250, with one or more sureties to be approved by the common council, conditioned that he will indemnify and be harmless to the city of Cottage Grove from all damage caused or suffered by defective work in making or repairing any sewer or plumbing work done by virtue of his said license.

Sec. 3. Any sewer builder or plumber taking up any street or alley for the purpose of making sewer or water connections or repairing the same shall restore and replace any earth, gravel or other material he may have removed therefrom in as good condition as he found it.

Sec. 4. Any sewer builder or plumber who shall be guilty of violating any rules now or hereafter adopted by the common council for the regulation of the building of sewers and plumbing shall immediately forfeit his license by order of the common council.

Sec. 5. A committee of the common council to be known as the Sewer Committee, to be appointed in the same manner and at the same time other committees are appointed; shall have charge of all sewers laid in said city and shall be the judge of their proper construction, use and operation and may under the direction of the common council appoint a suitable and competent person to have supervision over any such work, provided the water and light committee shall constitute said sewer committee until the time for the appointment of said committee.

Sec. 6. No connection with any sewer main or lateral in said city shall be made by any person without permit from said sewer committee and application for such permit shall be made in writing by the owner or tenant of property through his plumber or sewer builder, which permit shall be returned to said committee within 30 days from its issuance with the doings of said sewer builder endorsed thereon.

Sec. 7. All sewers shall be vitrified terra cotta sewer pipe and all joints shall be made with hydraulic cement and sand mixed in equal quantities and the inside of each sewer shall be left smooth and clean.

Sec. 8. All change of direction shall be made with curved pipes and connection with horizontal pipes shall be made with Y branches.

Sec. 9. Every house or building drain shall be trapped with a running trap of the same size as the drain. No connection with the drain shall be made on the street side of said trap.

Sec. 10. A proper grease trap shall be provided for all hotels, restaurants, butcher shops, lard rendering shops and all other places where the sewer committee shall require.

Sec. 11. Every water closet or other fixture connected with any sewer shall be provided with a sufficient quantity of water to keep the same at all times unobstructed and shall be provided with suitable plumbing to prevent leakage or waste of water.

Sec. 12.—No butchers' offal, garbage, dead animal, rags, dirt, stone, broken glass, or any mineral or metallic substance whatever shall be placed in any receiving basin, manhole, closet or sewer and any person violating the provisions of this section shall, upon conviction thereof be fined in a sum not exceeding \$25.

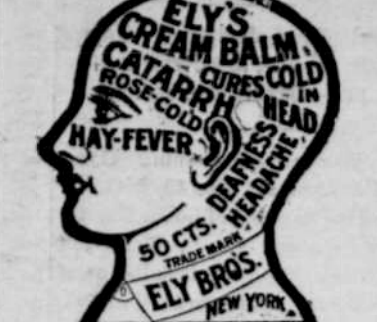
Sec. 13. Any person making or causing to be made any connection or opening with or into any public drain of said city without first having obtained permission as in this ordinance provided or making the same in any manner different than in this ordinance provided shall, upon conviction before the city recorder be fined in a sum not exceeding \$25.

Sec. 14. All persons erecting or maintaining privies, water closets, sinks, drains or cesspools in any sewer district now established or that may hereafter be established, within 100 ft. of any street or alley on which a sewer has or may hereafter be constructed, shall connect the same therewith at his own cost and expense in the manner and under the regulations provided in this ordinance.

Sec. 15. Any person erecting or maintaining any privy, water closet, cesspool, sink or drain as provided in Section 14 of this ordinance, who shall neglect or refuse to connect the same as provided in this ordinance for a period of ten days after notice to make such connection, given by the City Marshal, the city may make such connection and assess the cost thereof against the property upon which said privy, water closet, cesspool, sink or drain is situated and shall enter the same in the docket of city liens against such property and the collection of such lien shall be enforced by a warrant issued by the Recorder of said city in like manner as provided for the collection of street assessments.

Sec. 16. Any person severing any sewer connection made pursuant to

the provisions of this ordinance without first obtaining a permit from the sewer committee therefor shall upon conviction thereof be fined in a sum not exceeding \$25.

Sec. 17. The notice mentioned in section 15 of this ordinance shall be in writing signed by the city marshal and shall notify the person erecting or maintaining the said privy, water closet, cesspool, sink or drain or the owner or tenant of the land on which the same is situated to connect such privy, water closet, sink or drain, as herein provided within ten days from the service of such notice and the marshal shall keep a true copy of such notice, and file the same with his return of service thereof with the city recorder.

Sec. 18. Any person who shall refuse for a period of twenty days after the service on him of the notice mentioned in Section 17 of this ordinance, being the owner of the property upon which the said privy, water closet, cesspool, sewer or drain, if situated, shall upon conviction thereof before the city recorder be fined in a sum not exceeding \$25.

Sec. 19. Any privy, water closet, cesspool, sink or drain, located within any sewer district in the city of Cottage Grove now or hereafter to be established may be declared a nuisance by the common council of the city and may by service of a written notice in the manner provided in Section 17 of this ordinance be ordered closed until sewer connection is made.
