The Oregon Legislative assembly organized on Monday last and were soon at work. Senator Fulton of Astoria was elected President of the Senate and representative Reeder of Umatilla was the choice for speaker.

Morehead, of Junction, was again elect chief clerk of the Senate and Jennings of Irving Chief clerk of the House.

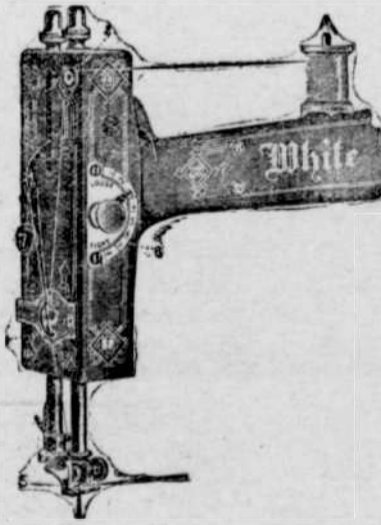

## TO PREVENT DECAY

Wood Preserver Used by Uncle Sm's on Yamhill River Work.
