Doings at the Capitol.

It seems to be difficult, if not impossible, for this administration to perform any official act that does not, directly or indirectly, open the way for a gang of thieves to profit at the expense of honest men. The ink was not dry on the proclamation for the opening to settlement of the Indian reservations in Oklahoma before the thieves had discovered a way to profit under the regulations provided for the opening and started the machinery for doing so. The machinery was ready before the proclamation, as it has been known for some time that honorably discharged soldiers, sailors, and marines would be allowed to enter homesteads through an agent, while others could only do so in person, and the general land laws gives ex-soldiers and sailors credit for the time they served, in the army or navy in counting the time necessary for residence on a homestead claim in order to acquire title, while all others must reside thereon for five years. That was all the land pirates, who are plentiful in Washington, wanted to know. They began hunting up the records of the honorably discharged soldiers and sailors, with three or more years service to their credit, and to make deals with them to have homestead entries made in their names, and as soon as the proclamation was issued they began telegraphing the names of these bogus homesteaders to their agents in Oklahoma, who will file the applications. Those applications which drew desirable land in the lottery to be held next month the pirates will hold on to by purchasing the claim of the soldier or sailor in whose name it is registered. One citizen of Oklahoma—Mr. Thos. F. Black—who is now in Washington and who knows all about the scheme of the land pirates, said: "The applications of honorably discharged soldiers and sailors for land will be many times greater than that of any other class, but I would like to bet that there will not be a corporal's guard of them who become settlers or even go to the Territory.

SOME FACTS.

There has been a great deal written from time to time upon the prospects and probable outlook for the Bohemia mines. This is not only so with Bohemia, but so with all other mining camps of any note. Glowing write-ups of rich discoveries, sensational stories of fabulous finds and wonderful assays have too frequently found their way into public print for the good, not only of the camps themselves, but for the good of the people at large. Every mining camp has had to outlive these kind of booms and settle down to hard work and steady development before any great amount of good has been accomplished. We believe Bohemia has passed through this stage of the game and is now getting down to a more solid basis. If it has there is no reason to doubt the camps permanency. The zeal and energy displayed by the different mine owners and prospectors throughout the camp, who are saying but little and working hard developing their claims and preparing for a long and steady pull, speaks volumes for Bohemia. The occasional sale of good property at a fair figure to large companies shows a confidence in the camps possibilities that outweighs all the cock and bull stories of fabulous finds that find their way into print, so far as men of means are concerned, and that such men more readily take hold of mining property after careful investigation into a well developed claim than they do of the boomer's prospect whose only showing is found on the certificate of a rich assay, goes without saying. We believe Bohemia is on the road to success at last and there is more reason to rejoice at the camp's prospect today than ever before.

Strong efforts are being made by the big interests behind the publications, fake and otherwise, that are getting the benefit of the \$30,000,000 a year the government loses by carrying at second class rates publications not entitled to be in that class, to frighten Postmaster General Smith into not issuing the announced order defining more strictly the requirements to be exacted of publications carried for one cent a pound. Mr. Smith says the order will be issued, and that it will accomplish its purpose, but it will be just as well to wait and see before giving him credit for possessing the courage to resist the influences which desire to go on profiting at the people's loss. If it be the real thing, the country will know it.
