That branch of the steel trust

overplaying its greed, and the result

is only necessary to mention one
article—crank shafting of which many
thousand pounds are used. This
government has to pay \$225 a
pound, while in England the same
garde of crank shafting sells for 48

Crop Bulletin.

Haying is nearing completion and
the crop, as a whole, is an average
one and has been secured in excel-
lent condition. The second crop of
alfalfa is making satisfactory pro-
gress. Cutworms have appeared in
the clover fields in Clackamas,
Marion, Linn and Curry counties,
but they are not nearly so numerous
as they were last year. The ranges
are drying up, as is usual at this
season of the year, but stock con-
tinues in excellent condition. The
harvest of fall-sown grain is becom-
ing general. Wheat, oats, rye and
barley in the Willamette valley con-
tinue doing well. The heads are
large and well filled with plump
berries. In Eastern Oregon the
prospects are not as favorable, as
there is considerable complaint of
small heads with shriveled berries,
and a good deal of the frosted
wheat in Union county has been cut
for hay. Spring wheat is generally
very promising, but in many sec-
tions it needs rain. In Southern
Oregon the protracted dry weather
has been injurious to grain, and the
yields there will be below the aver-
age. Hops are generally free from
lice and making satisfactory pro-
gress, although in some few sections
the lateral vines are reported def-
icient, which means that there will
be a corresponding shortage in the
yields. Corn, potatoes and gardens
continue making slow advancement,
and sugar beets are promising, but
all these crops, as a rule, would be
benefited by more rain as well as
by warmer weather. The cherry
season is drawing to a close and
early peaches and apples are begin-
ning to ripen.
