PITTSBURG, Sept. 4.—Agitation and uneasiness prevail in the ranks of the strikers tonight, caused by the apparently unfavorable developments of the day. The leaders, however, profess to be satisfied with present conditions, and declare that ultimate victory will be theirs. Much was hoped for from the peace conference in New York, but the announcement of the failure to reach a decision put a damper on these hopes. President Shaffer's only remark when shown the announcement of the adjournment without decision was:

"I have no comment to make."

Carnival Coming On.

On Wednesday evening, Sept 18, the Portland Carnival will open in a brilliant array of splendor such as is seldom seen in the Northwest. Mines and Mining.

MAGNET FOR GOLD FOUND.

After more than 22 years of patient study and experimenting, F M Mecarte, of San Juan, Cal insists that he has succeeded in perfecting a process whereby a piece of steel may be magnetized so as to attract gold, silver, copper, tin and other metals heretofore believed to be unsusceptible. Some two years ago Mecarte was experimenting with a view to discovering the lost art of tempering copper and accidentally discovered a process that would attract gold. The plan was so simple that he could not give public demonstrations of his discovery without exposing his secret, and consequently his statements were received with no great degree of credulity. But now that he has succeeded in imparting his mysterious force to a piece of steel he may show it with impunity. A practical demonstration was given. The magnet used was a common steel chisel which had been drawn out until the end presented a surface of from one-sixteenth of an inch by five-eighths of an inch. Although the surface was very small, it readily attracted shavings of gold, silver etc, which adhered very tenaciously.

The supreme court of California has ruled that if work is resumed on a mining location but not completed to the amount of \$100 before the first of January arrives on which forfeiture could occur, the claimant by continuing work into the new year and working continuously until the \$100 value of work is completed, protects the claim against forfeiture. It is not required that assessment work shall be done on Sunday to make the work continuous as contemplated by the statute. The work so performed, however is only valid for the year it was commenced and does not count for the year in which it is completed.
