Capital means to crush all opposition, it means to be master not only of itself but of labor, without which it could not exist. It not only combines and dictates the price of all it has to sell, but it dictates the terms under which labor can assist and build up capital.

Once again are the American people horror stricken at a dastardly attempt to kill the President. This time an avowed enemy of law and order, an anarchist of foreign decent conceives it his duty to slay the ruler of the nation not because he was a Lincoln or a Garfield or McKinley, but because he is a ruler. The merits or demerits of McKinley did not figure in the mind of the assassin, only the fact that he was President. Our Government has been criminally lax in its immigration laws for years. It has proceeded on the grounds that every cast-off thug coming from Europe would make a voter and a laborer and that was enough to fill the bill. Cheap and ignorant voters, foreigners without conscience who will readily take the place of strikers have been made welcome. The fact that they might be anarchists and have no respect for our institutions cut no figure. They were admitted and often under contract. And as a result of laws enacted for the benefit of corporations and manufacturers and foreign immigration, the president now lies at the point of death. The republican party has no one to blame for this state of affairs but itself.
