Now it seems that the canal treaty so widely heralded last week is not the treaty agreed to do at all, but merely that suggested by the United States. The British Government's idea of the proper thing, which is very different is now on its way to this country in the possession of Lord Pauncefote.

A confiding Washington correspondent informs us that all the Cabinet officers have personally informed him that they are not thinking of resigning. Cabinet officers, it has been observed, always come to a decision in a matter like this with a rapidity that is positively startling. They never intend to resign until the President has accepted their resignations.

When General Otis declared that the outbreak in Samar was merely sporadic and would not be repeated, the American people girded up their loins for further bad news, knowing General Otis' little ways. It has now come. Another American squad has been pretty nearly wiped out by the rebels there, who do not seem quite so anxious for American rule as we have been told. More General Chaffee has cabled that he cannot afford to have his force reduced as had been anticipated.

In order to get rid of a portion of the vast sum in excess of the needs of Government that has been exacted from the people of the United States, the Secretary of the Treasury has been paying for bonds an average of \$1.36 for every dollar due for them. That is to say, where a man invested three dollars in government bonds he is receiving four in return, not through any rise in the market value but simply because the government cannot afford to store the money away from the channels of trade. When it is noted further that this money is extorted from all of us simply in order to maintain the protection to the steel and other trusts, its outrageous character becomes even more evident.
