Mr. Roosevelt believes that hereafter the Indian should be treated as a unit and not as a member of a tribe; recommends generous support of the Charleston and St. Louis expositions and the Smithsonian Institute and the National Museum. He advises that the Census Bureau be made permanent; that Congress assist in the removal of abuse of the second class mail privilege; commends the "open-door policy" in China; hopes for beneficial results from the pan-American Congress; urges the return by Congress of the Well and La Abra award fraudulently obtained from Mexico and closes with congratulation upon the cordial relation existing between the United States and foreign nations.

Claim jumpers occasionally do a great injustice to claim owners through a mistaken notion as to whether the annual representation work has been done. It often happens that the claim jumper has no other authority for assuming that a claim is jumpable than the fact that no record of annual representation work has been made in the office of the county clerk. In default of the record he assumes that the claim has been abandoned. He is not justified in this. The law does not make such a record mandatory. It does not even require it to be made. It merely says the claim owner "may" make such a record within twenty days from the completion of such work, setting forth certain facts.

Mines and Mining.

A NEW MINING COMPANY

The Hiawatha Mining and Milling Co have filed articles of incorporation with County Clerk Lee. The incorporators are Alfred Johnson John E Russell and F G Eby, and the principal place of business is Cottage Grove. The capital stock of the corporation is given as \$100,000 divided into 1,000,000 shares with a value of 10 cents each. The object of the corporation is to engage in the general mining and milling business in the Bohemia district.

RICH BODY OF COPPER

On the Belcher claim, owned by the United States Consolidated Gold Mining Company in the Bohemia district, the principal stockholders in which are Messrs I W Poke and F S Day of this city, a fine bed of copper ore has just been opened. Assessor Herbert Leigh, who returned yesterday from a trip to Bohemia brought down with him some small samples of the ore, assays of which are being made this afternoon. Mr Leigh said this morning the samples showed much richness and he expected them to assay very high.—Guard.

THE LEROY

Frank LeRoy came out from the mines the first of the week on business. Connected with his visit is the transaction of a number of deals which when consummated will mean a great deal for the company. Mr LeRoy brought out a number of samples from the ledge where they are now working. In the shaft at a depth of 18 feet the ledge is 6 feet wide with 30 inches of the richest galena ore that has ever been uncovered in the camp. The company is having a new geared hand hoist made at the Eugene foundry. When placed in position over the shaft they will be able to lift 1000 pounds of ore.
