ANOTHER PIONEER GONE.

The Hon D P Thompson a well known capitalist and ex-United States minister to Turkey, died early Saturday morning at Portland, Or. Mr Thompson was born in Ohio in 1834. He came to Oregon in 1853 walking every step of the way across the continent. In 1874 he was appointed governor of Idaho Territory by President Grant, and during the latter part of President Harrison's administration he served as United States minister to Turkey. During the early nineties Mr Thompson was president of seventeen national banks in the Northwest at one time.

DIAMOND THIEVES ARRESTED.

OMAHA, Dec 11--W H Woods and a female companion, giving the name of True Johnson both of whom are colored were arrested by the local police today charged with having robbed Alfred F Lowenthal, a traveling salesman for a New York jewelry firm, in a Portland, Or, hotel, of \$15,000 worth of diamonds and jewelry. The jewelry was traced by a local pawnbroker, who had received a printed circular description of the stolen property, to Woods and his companion, and they were found in the eastern part of the city. When arrested there was found in their possession \$3000 worth of diamonds and jewelry, railroad transportation to Portland and a check for \$200 which had been given by the pawnbroker in exchange for a diamond brooch.

The woman denies having had any knowledge of where the jewelry came from and Woods refuses to talk.

The Schley Case.

Court of Inquiry Condemn Commodore Schley on 11 Points.

Dewey takes Another View.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 13.--The report of Schley court of inquiry was promulgated by Secretary Long tonight. There are two reports.

Admiral Benham and Admiral Ramsay concur in the first, which is signed by Admiral Dewey also, as a matter of form. Admiral Dewey makes a separate report, although he agrees with the findings of facts subscribed to by the others.

The majority report condemns Admiral Schley on 11 points, while Admiral Dewey sustains him in most places.

THE COURT'S FINDINGS.

Opinion: The turn of the Brooklyn to starboard was made to avoid getting her into dangerous proximity to the Spanish vessels. The turn was made toward the Texas, and caused that vessel to stop and back her engine to avoid possible collision.

Admiral Schley did injustice to Lieutenant-Commander A C Hodgson in publishing only a portion of the correspondence which passed between them.

Commodore Schley's conduct in connection with the events of the Santiago campaign prior to June 1, 1898, was characterized by vacillation, dilatoriness and lack of enterprise.

His official reports regarding the coal supply, and the coaling facilities of the flying squadron, were inaccurate and misleading.

His conduct during the battle of July 3 was self-possessed, and he encouraged in his own person, his subordinate officers and men to fight courageously.

ADMIRAL DEWEY'S OPINION.

In the opinion of the undersigned the passage from Key West to Cienfuegos was made by the flying squadron with all possible dispatch, Commodore Schley having in view the importance in arriving off Cienfuegos with as much coal as possible in the ship's bunkers.

The blockade of Cienfuegos was effective. Commodore Schley in permitting the steamer Adula to enter the port of Cienfuegos expected to obtain information regarding the Spanish squadron from her when she came out.

The passage from Cienfuegos to a point about 22 miles south of Santiago was made with as much dispatch as possible while keeping the squadron a unit.

The blockade of Santiago was effective.

Commodore Schley was the senior officer of our squadron off Santiago when the Spanish squadron attempted to escape on the morning of July 3 1898. He was in absolute command and is entitled to the credit due to such commanding officer for the glorious victory which resulted in the total destruction of the Spanish ships.

Admiral Dewey was seen late to night, and declined to make any statement concerning the court's findings. He said that the court was not dissolved, and that he was still bound by his oath to secrecy.

WASHINGTON, Dec 16.--At the opening of to-day's session of the Senate Mr. Jones (Ark) introduced a joint resolution as follows:

"That the thanks of Congress and the American people are hereby tendered to Rear-Admiral Winfield S Schley and officers and men under his command for highly distinguished conduct in conflict with the enemy, as displayed by them in the destruction of the Spanish fleet off the harbor of Santiago, Cuba, July 3, 1898.

"That the President of the United States be requested to cause this resolution to be communicated to Rear-Admiral Schley and through him to the officers and men under his command."

Without comment the resolution was referred to the committee on naval affairs.

WASHINGTON, Dec 16.--At the conference between Admiral Schley and his council today it was decided to ask Secretary Long to withhold his approval of the findings of the court of inquiry until such time as the Admiral through his counsel, can file an objection thereto. The request was delivered to Secretary Long, and while he has not yet answered the communication it is understood the request will be granted.
