FORGER VERNON CAUGHT

Sheriff W W Withers arrived home from California Sunday morning, having in charge George Vernon, the violinist, who passed worthless checks on two Lane county men.

The charge on which Vernon was arrested in Springfield, he gave a check to Merchant J W Stewart for \$31.19, drawn on the First National Bank of Bank of Portland, with the name of Geo A Smelton signed to it. The day previous he gave a check for \$10, signed by himself on the same bank to W S Lenard, of Co-burg. When they were presented in Eugene for collection shortly afterward it was found that they were worthless and that the one given to Mr Stewart was a forgery. In the meantime Vernon had left for points south, leaving the next night after giving the check to Mr Stewart.

Vernon was taken before Justice Wintermeier Monday where he pleaded guilty to two charges, that of obtaining money under false pretenses and of forgery, and was bound over to appear at the next term of circuit court. Failing to give bonds, he was remanded back to jail.
