

BREAKING COLTS.

The work of breaking colts on the farm is generally made to fit in at a time when the other work is slack. Every effort however, should be made to handle the colts as much as possible at all times. When a colt becomes accustomed to persons and has more or less rubbed and handled it is then most easily subjected to the after work of breaking. A colt that is well halter broken, and will stand to have each part handled, is well grounded in breaking.

By doing this it also enables the person who is to handle the colt to study his disposition. There is more in this feature than anything connected with the breaking of colts that we know of. It is remarkable the number of different systems of breaking that are followed but analyses of these systems will show that they are more or less dependent for their success on the disposition of the individual owners. Some colts after being halter broken and handled may be taught to drive very easily. They do not fret when the harness is put on them and hitched, and they go off quietly and then with careful handling, soon become reliable. On the other hand, there are others that are always more or less irritable, inclined to be sour or vicious. A different course of procedure has to be taken with them. Where a colt is naturally high lived but intelligent the right course is to coax rather than attempt to force it. It is surprising what can be done by patiently handling such colts if this idea is kept in view. The more intelligent a horse is the more likely he is to resist force, but the same horse may likely be the most responsive to intelligent direction. With such it is necessary, in the first place, to gain their confidence. This can only be done by handling carefully and never losing one's temper. The abuse of such colts will undoubtedly spoil their future.

On the other hand there are some that are high strung and at the same time lack in intelligence. These are the hardest to handle because a system of coaxing is usually utterly futile in persuading them to do any thing. As a rule force is necessary. To break a colt of this kind probably the best plan is to put it in with an older and steadier horse and give it its first work in this way. If such a colt once finds that he has obtained mastery then he is likely to develop into a very unsatisfactory animal. In the instance of the other kind that has intelligence, if handled properly it may become absolutely reliable. In such cases it is seldom necessary to more than put on the harness and hitch such a colt to the breaking cart and it will be found that it will enjoy driving and readily take to breaking. The most unsatisfactory colt to handle is one that is almost full grown, possessed of all its strength and yet has never been subjected to even halter breaking. Severe measures have to be taken in such instances, even to throwing the animal to get the halter on and then hobbling it to put on the harness. The front hobble should be left down even when such a colt is hitched up with another horse for the reason that it has unusual power and unless controlled in some way like this may succeed in doing considerable damage to its attachments. In all such cases a strict kicking strap should also be employed and no chances taken in any way for such an animal is sure to resist breaking to the fullest extent.

FOWLS LIKE A CHANGE.

No matter what food is given the fowls, they will, after a while, tire of it unless given a change. Laying hens are never so well contented as when allowed to gather a grain here and a grain there—never getting an oversupply at one time.

If whole grain food is given, oats, wheat and corn should alternate. Never give the same grain two successive days, and a mixture of grains at no time.

The most important point to consider is that of forcing the hens to work.

Bury the grain well in the straw or litter, and if possible, keep the hens going from sunrise to sunset.

If any soft food is given it should be fed at the noon hour, but never in such quantity that the hens will refuse to work longer.

See that the scratching shed is light and airy, and the hens will not object to staying there.

Don't force the fowls to drink ice cold water. Tepid water is preferable, and should be given at least three times a day during the cold weather.
