### WILLIAMS IS DEAD.

DRAIN, Or, Jan 13.—T R Williams the unfortunate man who was pierced with a flying piece of wood at the Leona mills last Tuesday, died Sunday evening at six o'clock, after a most remarkable struggle for life. Both lungs were pierced by a piece of wood over an inch in diameter, and being wedged between the ribs required the aid of two men to withdraw it, yet his life was prolonged for over five days afterward. Williams was about 35 years of age, He leaves a wife but no other relatives in this state. His mother lives in Michigan. He was a social member of the Woodman of the World Camp here, and will be buried by that order this afternoon in the Drain cemetery.

### A NEW IDEA.

The use of a belt of windmills to light the entire city of Chicago was presented as a possibility of the future by Franklin H Head in a lecture before the students in the College of Commerce and administration at the University of Chicago Monday evening. The picture which Mr Head suggested a series of windmills running dynamos, which would charge storage batteries with electricity. This statement was made to illustrate the enormous value to the world of a new storage battery invented by Eddison. Mr Head has a model of the battery on the chapel desk before him, and made reference to it in a digression from an interesting lecture on "The Steel Industry".

"When I was in New York recently, my old friend, Mr Eddison, told me of a new storage battery he had invented," said Mr Head after some apologetic remarks in reference to his digression. "If what he thinks is true, he has made a most valuable storage battery for electricity. The lead storage is used on one street car line to-day is too expensive; it weighs seven tons and has to be recharged after every four-mile trip. The new battery Mr Eddison has invented weighs in proportion one fourth and seems indestructible. He has had batteries in his laboratory a year and a half and they have kept their charge of electricity. His invention is of enormous value to the world.

"There are endless sources of power about us if only the power they afford could be stored up. Take the windmill; it is not constant. But with the new Edison battery the windmill could run a dynamo when the wind blows and the power generated could be saved by a storage battery.

"A belt of windmills around Chicago, say for forty miles could supply storage batteries with enough electricity to light the whole city of Chicago constantly and possibly, to heat it too."

## Mines and Mining.

Secretary Hard, of the mining exchange, has returned from Cottage Grove and the Bohemia mining district says the Telegram. He covered 90 miles on horseback making the principal properties in the camp, and what is unusual for this season of the year encountered no snow.

In speaking of the camp Mr Hard this morning said: "There is more activity in the Bohemia mining district than ever there has been before, and if it gets the projected railroad from Cottage Grove there is no reason why Bohemia should not furnish a large share of Oregon's annual output of gold. Development work is being prosecuted with energy. At the Vesuvius the aprise recently made establishes the continuity of the oxidized ore body from the surface to the 350 foot level. The troubles of the Riverside property have been settled, the men payed off and development work is also being carried on at the Oregon-Colorado. The Helena mill is shut down, but underground work is still in progress."

Mr Hard brought some fine specimens of Oregon-Colorado ores back with him. Wednesday night he attended the mass meeting of citizens and property-owners held at Cottage Grove for the purpose of making some of the backward land-owners come to time in the matter of granting rights of way for the projected Bohemia railroad. In reference to the meeting Mr Hard said:

"The meeting was harmonious and all present seem to be anxious that every obstacle to the building of the road be removed. B F Morphy, the promoter of the road, represented that he had backing to the extent of \$500,000, and that the money was already put up. All present pledged their hearty support to the enterprise, and a committee was appointed to assist Mr Morphy to secure the rights of way still desired. If the promoters of the road have the money as they say they have there is no reason why the Bohemia district should not have the railroad inside of a year."

### JUDSON ROCK COMPANY.

J M Sherwood, vice president of the Judson Rock Mining Company, whose principal office is in Cottage Grove, returned to that place yesterday after spending four days in Eugene. He disposed of 25,000 shares of stock in Eugene at 10 cents per share. The property is very valuable and the ore runs up a good average. The company has marketed over 100,000 shares in Cottage Grove and Eugene alone. Mr Sherwood says Eugene is not slow about investing in good property.—Register.
