The postal department at Washington has certainly added the central star to its crown of political nonsense, this time. The Commoner, Bryan's paper, has been refused admission as second class matter when sent through the mail as sample copies. The ground for refusal is that Mr Bryan is advertising a doctrine or theory. Of all the bosh ever given out to the people as an excuse for pure and unadulterated political spite on the part of the officials at Washington, this takes the cake. The next thing Mr Bryan knows he will be enjoined from breathing free air on the ground that he might demonstrate and advertise the idea that the air is good for a democrat as well a republican official.

The Ways and Means Committee of the House is devoting its time to hearings of the representatives of the tobacco and sugar interests in this country and in Cuba, apropos of the proposed reciprocal relations with that island. That there is any earnest desire on the part of the Committee to ascertain the real status of affairs in Cuba must be doubted by anyone who has an opportunity to hear the merciless cross-examination of the Cuban representatives. Their somewhat limited command of English is a draw back in itself and when to that is added a disposition on the part of the members of the committee, unrestrained by the chairman, to abuse and browbeat the Cuban witness it can hardly be credited that the committee desires to arrive at the facts.

While the republicans in the House are opposed to reciprocity, there are those among them whose constituents are demanding the removal of the duty on certain schedules and they say they will have their way. Representative Babcock declares that he will be able to bring to light his bill lowering the duty on the products of the Steel Trust and that he can secure sufficient votes to make it a law. Mr Tawney, of Minnesota, says that he is only awaiting an appropriate opportunity to introduce some measure removing the duty on bulbs imported from Holland. United States Consul Hill, at Amsterdam, has made an extensive report on this subject in which he shows that we import from \$275,000 to \$300,000 worth of bulbs from Holland per year and that we sell to Holland flour worth in the neighborhood of \$4,500,000. This trade is likely to be lost to the millers and farmers of the United States unless some measure is passed which will remove the duty
