One of the greatest revivals of religion ever known in the history of Cottage Grove is now in progress at the Methodist church. The christian people have laid aside all sectarianism and are working together in that spirit of love which is beautifully typified in the life of the wise and gifted Solomon. They realize that a grand revival of true religion is needed in Cottage Grove. Indeed such a revival is now at hand, and the whole town is now trembling in the throes of a new life, spiritually. A revival "In His name" to get people converted "to God, Truth and to love of God's Creation" is what has long been needed, here, as well as over the entire world, instead of that usually carried on which seeks your relation with some particular church, which unless your purse is ample and open knows you only in its membership report. The true revival is needed, generally speaking, as badly by the church as by any other class.

The House Committee on Coinage, Weights, and Measures is this week hearing the opinions of leading manufacturers and business men on the subject of making the metric system compulsory in this country. Scientists are all in favor of it, but there is yet a question as to what the practical business world thinks. It is already adopted as the legal system, and the present action is taken to see whether it will be wise to enforce its use in all government transactions.

A new law in Iceland authorizes any adult to administer a sound spanking to any child found smoking a cigarette, and to destroy any of the "destroyers" that are found in the possession of children. This will probably create the necessity of a law to protect people who spank other peoples children from assault by irate parents.

The utter failure of civil government in the Philippines shows that the present investigation in Congress should be through. Too much light cannot be had on the dark mystery that has been thrown about the whole question by those who have been trying to blind the eyes of the country to the true state of affairs.

Under the present system of taxation a surplus is rolling up in the Treasury. This is all wrong, for the government has no right to take from the people more than enough for its necessary and legitimate expenses.

Secretary Root says he will bring 10,000 soldiers home from the Philippines, but 5,533 soldiers have just been sent there. Actions speak louder than words.

REGISTRATION.

Voters of Oregon have a general misconception of the registration law, which was in effect for the first time at the general election of 1900. Electors who registered two years ago seems to think that it is not required of them to register again this year. In this they are mistaken, for under this legislation it is necessary for them to register every two years if they desire to exercise their rights of suffrage.

The primary object of the registration law is the protection of honest voters at the polls by putting a safeguard around their ballot and protecting them from those who indulge in the practice of fraudulent voting. Requiring a man to register and vote in his own precinct is a preventive of the practice of those who value the votes from the standard of dollars and cents from voting more than once and tends to keep the American ballot pure. If every voter could see that it is a protection to the dignity of the ballot to throw around it by means of registration the protection it deserves, there would be no hesitancy about registering promptly in the various precincts.

It should be done in mind that no man can vote who is not registered unless he gets six freeholders to swear that he is a resident of the precinct and entitled to vote. To save this bother confusion and delay at the polls, it is much better to register and then the voter is fully protected in his right to cast a free, American ballot.
