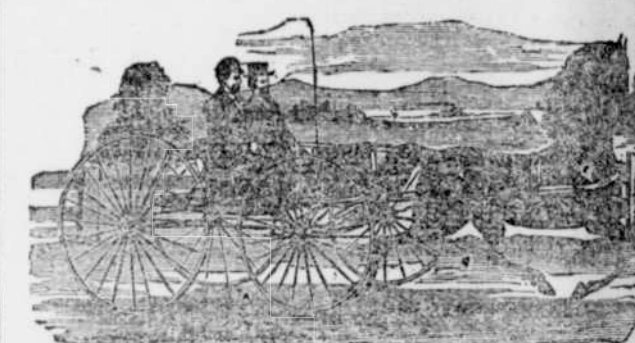
**DIED.**
