### RAIL ROAD CONSOLIDATION

New York, April 16.—As a result of E E Harriman's extended trip to the Pacific Coast it is rumored in Wall street that there will be a further consolidation of the railroad lines composing the Harriman system.

The rumor goes so far as to be in some quarters a positive announcement that all the lines west of the Rocky Mountains will be operated from some central point, making the operating headquarters of the system at either Salt Lake or Ogden.

This, it is said, involves merely maintaining nominal general offices to satisfy legal requirements and supervise steamship connections at Pacific Coast terminal points, such as San Francisco, Cal., for the Southern Pacific, and Portland, Or., for the Oregon Railroad, but the executive force and chief operating center will be established at a more central point.

Men well informed in regard to the Harriman properties generally agree that this means the abolishment of several expensive offices and salaried positions among the various branches of the system, and it is spoken of as a long step toward effecting economical management of this great transcontinental chain.

### TRANSVAAL PEACE IN THE BALANCE.

LONDON, April 14.—It is reported that a communication has been made by the Boer leader to General Lord Kitchener which is little more than a request for permission to use its cable to consult with President Kruger and the Boer delegates in Europe with regard to a basis of settlement.

In the House of Commons today the Government leader announced that a message was received from General Lord Kitchener on Saturday in which was included a communication which General Kitchener had received from the Boer leaders and the reply he sent.

The Government expected further communications and this, he added, was all it was possible for him to say.

LONDON, April 16.—The ministers of the Cabinet were hurriedly summoned to a meeting this morning.

A communication regarding the situation in South Africa was received last night.

It is feared that some hitch has occurred in the negotiations for peace with the Boers.
