### SOUTH LANE'S NEED.

The south end of Lane County has not been represented in the county court for twenty years, and as a result of this neglect on the part of Lane County people the roads in this end of the county have become a public nuisance. While it is true that on account of the numerous streams and bridges which have to be crossed the county has been put to considerable expense in the past few years in repairs and road work for the benefit of the people of this section it is also equally true that the people have borne their share of the burden of taxation with scarcely a murmur, and they have contributed into the county treasury thousands upon thousands of dollars. The hold over commissioner is from the North end of the county, and the County Judge is at Eugene and Cottage Grove asks that the next Commissioner the people elect be given to this end of the county, and they ask it without respect to party. The republicans tried to get a commissioner named in Cottage Grove but the party bosses at Eugene said No. The democrats tried to name a commissioner in this part of the county two years ago but the north end of the county and Eugene refused them that privilege. This year it is different. The democratic delegates went down to Eugene from Cottage Grove, Saginaw and Creswell united to a man and with blood in their eyes and as a result they named a man for that place, well known throughout the county, a man of unblemished

character and of first class business ability, a man among the heaviest of Lane county taxpayers, and a man that every one who knows him need have no fears in supporting. They named Mr J P Currin and we believe the people throughout Lane county irrespective of party will see the necessity of electing Mr Currin and will not fail to do so. Politics should not should not enter into commissioners fight. The people do not pay taxes for the building of republican roads and bridges or for running democratic rock crushers. ### THE JUDSON ROCK MINING COMPANY.

One of the most promising mining companies in the Bohemia district today is the Judson Rock Co. This company owns a group of nine claims, so located as to make them very desirable property. Three or four famous ledges, viz the Musick, Vesuvius, Harlow & Stock and the Hawatha, can be traced through these claims. There has been about \$5000 worth of development work done on the property and the company is now ready to place shares on the market for the purpose of raising money to further develop their holdings. This week J M Sherwood and John Currin, both members of the company, left for Portland, Seattle, Spokane and other points in the interest of the company. Shares are now selling at 5 cents the par value being 10 cents, and with the present showing the company has they will soon go to par and possibly above.

### SENATOR KUYKENDAL AND HIS RECORD

The Champion of Cheap Chinese and Japanese Labor.

That Senator Kuykendal is owned body and soul by corporations and is an enemy of the laboring classes is clearly proven by his record in the last Oregon Legislature. The Senate Journal of the last State Legislature, upon page 137, shows that upon the 24th day of January, 1901, quoting the words of the Senate Journal, "Senator Kuykendal moved to amend by striking out" the Memorial to Congress asking for the reenactment of the Chinese and Japanese Exclusion laws, and he gave a long and bitter debate against the passage of the Memorial.

Speaking of this, the Daily Oregonian, a Republican newspaper, on the 25th day of January, 1901, says, quoting the exact words, "In discussion of the Memorial. Senator Kuykendal provoked a spirited debate by moving to strike out the sections extending the act to Japanese and other Mongolians, on the plea that the Japanese were progressive and civilized. He further declared that he was personally opposed to all exclusion laws and believed that the United States could compete with the entire world." He also said that he needed cheap labor to develop this grand and beautiful Pacific Coast.

Senator is the employee and champion of the Southern Pacific railroad for Lane County. The railroad Co want cheap labor, and Senator Kuykendal is willing to obey the dictates of the R. R. Co. and open the gates for the flooding of the Coast by the "yellow terror," rather than work for the interests of the laboring classes. He further more is the champion of the R. R. Co., in preventing the passing by the legislature of a 3c mile law, and a maximum freight law. Our candidate for Senator, pledges himself to work at all times for the people, rather than for the Railroad. And, is elected, he will introduce a law to take the people out of the clutches of the R. R. Co. You can not expect any assistance from their employee and their doctor.

Twelve cents per bushel for wheat and \$9.20 to ship a horse from Eugene to Portland is robbery of Lane County farmers by the R. R. Corporation. Thousands of people coming west are settling in Washington to rather than Oregon, because Oregon has the reputation of being within the clutches of the Southern Pacific Railroad.

These facts are sufficient to prove to the entire satisfaction of the rank and file of the republican party in Lane County that Mr Kuykendal is the tool of Corporation and as such is bound to be a hindrance to any legislation that is calculated to be of benefit to the people. The people therefore should let him down with a dull thud and we believe they will do so. It is to the interest of every good and honest republican as well as all democrats that the republican bosses in this county be made to know the peoples rights should be respected and that no candidate who is forced upon them by corporation bosses, whose record is as cloudy as Senator Kuykendal's can be elected.

The firm of Campbell & Alexander of this city is also connected with the contract. Mr Morphy was in Portland and made satisfactory arrangements with the S. P. Company to connect the road with the main line at this city.

It is thought that material will arrive here and that work will be commenced on the grading next week.

Mr Long says that his interview with Mr Kohler of the Southern Pacific Company regarding a new depot at this place was very satisfactory indeed and that it is his opinion that there will be a Union depot built. A new depot is something that has long been needed here and every one will be pleased to learn that we are to have it at last.
