

BANK ROBBERY

AT BROWNSVILLE.

BROWNSVILLE, April 29.—Yesterday noon Mr J H Glass, cashier of the bank of Brownsville, locked the bank up as usual and went to dinner. Upon his return at 1 o'clock he was astonished to find that the bank had been entered and somewhere between \$1600 and \$1800 in cash stolen, just how much is not known. A bolt in the rear door was broken and the door forced open. All the money in sight was secured and the burglar left without being observed.

The robbery was done apparently by at least three persons. Indications are that one robber stood guard at the front of the building and one at the rear, while the third entered through a rear window and door and gained access to the vault proper, which is burglar-proof, and closed and locked only the inner doors. The robber attacked these doors with a small piece of steel. He easily broke the lock and gained access to the money. In his hurry the robber failed to get a large amount of cash. He took only what he could grab and fled.

It was nearly 1 o'clock when Mr Glass opened the bank and made the discovery of the robbery. The police were immediately notified, and soon had taken into custody W O Tyeer and Thomas Vennum. The bank officials later swore out warrants against them, and they were held for examination before the district attorney today.

NEW U. S. BATTLESHIPS.

WASHINGTON, Apr 25.—The House committee on naval affairs today completed the naval appropriation bill. The most important item as to new ships was left until the last, and as finally determined upon is as follows:

Two battleships of about 16,000 tons displacement to cost, exclusive of armor and armament, \$4,212,000 each; two armored cruisers of about 14,500 tons displacement to cost, exclusive of armor and armament, \$4,659,000; two gunboats of 1000 tons each, to cost \$382,000 each.

The weather during the week has been abnormally cool, with light scattering showers over nearly all sections of the State. With the exception of a few of the northern counties in the Willamette valley the rainfall was not of sufficiently long duration as to seriously interfere with outdoor work, and plowing and seeding made satisfactory progress. There has been considerably more sunshine on the average than during the preceding weeks of the month and the few warm, bright days have caused an improvement in the condition and color of fall-sown wheat.

Grass and alfalfa have made a lustrant growth, and meadows, pastures and ranges are reported to be in excellent condition. There is now plenty of feed for stock on the range, and in the dairy sections there has been a satisfactory increase in the supply of milk. With the exception of apples, fruit trees all over the State are now in bloom, and in portions of the Willamette valley Italian prunes have begun to set. The outlook is very promising for an abundant yield of fruit. Stock continues to improve, and sheep shearing has commenced in some localities. In Lane county, Angora goats are being sheared.
