For many years past the Oregon legislature has been under control of one political party, the majority having been overwhelming, and in consequence the party in power has become emboldened to deal carelessly with the people's interests. Jobs have been worked through that were questionable and savored much of dishonesty. Money exacted by taxation from the people has been appropriated lavishly, though to no general good for the state. Offices

and salaries fixed at figures far beyond what is reasonable compensation for the service rendered. Senatorial contests have been surrounded with alleged corruption that has gone undenied, and one session the house was prevented from organizing, and the next session the legislature appropriated nearly \$50,000 of the people's money to pay the salaries and expenses of the session that was never held. If Oregon were a close state politically, likely to go either republican or democratic such high handed and questionable acts would not occur. No party unless fortified by a strong majority would dare be so flagrant in its conduct of public affairs.

It is indeed high time a change were made; in fact it is indeed in that the people's interest may be guarded. We are not so party bound that we consider one party entirely bad and another supremely good. We fully realize that all parties are composed of human beings, each possessing in a degree a certain amount of patriotism and honesty; but any party long in power becomes bold and reckless of the interests of the masses; too willing to use public positions as rewards for party fealty; ready to appropriate public funds for the payments of party debts.

We believe that the people of Lane realize these facts and that at the June election will roll up a good majority for Hon Lee M Travis for senator, Castle, Edmundson and Hale for representatives.

Senator Kuykendal is out this week with a two or three column denial in the Register of his record while in the Oregon Legislature as published by the Leader some time ago. Had the Leader intended, to in any way misrepresent Mr Kuykendal for political effect it would have reserved such publication until the eve of election when refusal could have been impossible. It was fully expected that the Senator would try to smooth over these charges and it will be our pleasure next week to show how well he has succeeded. To our readers we will say now that it is not a question of "strabismus" political or otherwise. It is a question of facts and we believe just a little airing will do no harm.

cover damages for injuries received through the negligence, carelessness or incompetence of a fellow workman. He will endeavor to secure the passage of such law and believes it can be effected. The initiative and referendum will also apply along this line. The municipal ownership of public utilities is also favored as being economical public policy.

The exclusion of Chinese, Japanese, and in fact all oriental races is favored in the interest of American workingmen. The promoters of the ship subsidy bill argued that among other things it would benefit American navy. Yet, at the instance of the big steamship owners, the clause prohibiting Chinese sailors on American ships was stricken out of the exclusion bill just passed.

On electing U S senators by a direct vote of the people, it was shown that the only party organization really in favor of such a measure is the democrats, who placed the name of their nominee upon the ticket. The rank and file of the republicans are now preparing to do the same by petition, notwithstanding the opposition of politicians who want to leave the matter open to fight over in the legislature.

As a curative for the trust evil and exorbitant trust prices, the first step is to remove the tariff protection on trust-controlled products. The trust promoters promised that by combination they could raise wages and lower the price of products but often the reverse had resulted. The workingmen can only protect themselves and each other by organization, and are meeting with a considerable degree of success in this way.

On the Philippine question the opposition is simply throwing dust in the people's eyes and trying to draw attention away from the much more important affairs at home. A state government has nothing to do with the control of the islands. They belong to the general government

what is eventually to be done with them. The last national republican platform and the present democratic state platform are much the same in regard to the islands. The rights of the people should be given proper consideration and to that end the constitution should follow the flag and strife barriers be removed. Trade expansion is favored but it is not necessary to kill people to secure it. If we tax the Filipino we should also educate him. Instead of answering the charging of official extravagance at home, the opposition cry, what is to become of Oregon on the Philippine policy.

Regarding the outlook for success Mr Chamberlain repeated that he expects to be elected and notwithstanding the claims of the opposition he will carry Multnomah county by a larger majority than he did two years ago. His speech was frequently interrupted by applause.

PROF W A WANN, nominee for state superintendent of schools, was next introduced, and in an address of 10 minutes he showed a few of baneful effects of the "cramping" by the present public school system. Teachers and pupils must both "cramp" for examinations, and thoroughness is often sacrificed as a result, besides. Children are often in danger of becoming nervous wrecks. As ninety per cent of the children never go beyond the eighth grade, thorough work in the fundamental principles is very necessary in fitting them for their work in life. To do this a change in the present system is necessary, cutting out the non-essentials. Prof Wann made a very favorable impression.

HENRY BLACKMAN nominee for state treasurer, came next. He was suffering from hoarseness and talked but five minutes. He cited his official record, having been mayor of Heppner, Or, for four terms, state senator for four years and U S collector of internal revenue for Oregon. He favored flat salaries and a number of other meritorious measures. He said Mr Chamberlain will carry Eastern Oregon by 1,500 majority. His talk made favorable impression.

REPUBLICAN SPEAKING

The republican candidates for state officers visited Cottage Grove Wednesday morning. Mr Furnish the nominee for Governor was the first speaker and there were a considerable number of people present. The usual amount of enthusiasm however was markedly absent. Indeed the meeting was termed even by many good substantial and influential republicans as a "frost." Scarcely a ripple of applause greeted the introduction of Mr Furnish, any part of his remarks, or the close of his speech. "Mr Furnish is a dead failure" is not an uncommon expression since Wednesday's fiasco. Whatever under the heavens induced the republican party in this state to turn down a man like Governor Geer whom the people at large at least respect and who has served his party for years with fidelity and honor, for a man like Mr Furnish, with not the shadow of a claim of party services of brilliant oratorical ability, or popularity is a question that has not as yet been answered. Republicans admit that he has none of these qualities and yet they turn down their leaders right and left and head their ticket with an experiment. If the sentiment of Cottage Grove is in line with other parts of the state it will cost the party the loss of thousands of votes.
