A HORRIBLE ACCIDENT AT ROSEBURG

ROSEBURG May 1.—Thomas C Owens was fatally shot by Policeman Frank Reed this morning.

Owens was beating his way on a southbound train, and ran when the policeman who was looking for a man who stole an overcoat at Gilliam's Saloon, Eugene ordered him to stop.

Policeman, Reed fired, when Owens fell shot through the head, mortally wounded. He lived but five hours never recovering consciousness. The policeman claims that he fired at the ground and that the ball glanced and killed the man. Reed surrendered himself to the custody of the sheriff.

Owens was twenty three years of age and unmarried. He lives at Myrtle Creek Douglas county. He held a teacher's certificate which was found on his person.

He had been in Cottage Grove for week previous to his sad fate and formerly lived here.

HELD FOR MANSLAUGHTER.

City Marshal Reed is likely to have a serious time in extricating himself from the trouble brought about by his shooting Thomas C Owen on Thursday. At the inquest held up on the body of Owen, the coroner's jury brought in a verdict in accordance with the facts, adding, that "in the opinion of this coroner's jury, the said Frank Reed is guilty of the crime of manslaughter."

The accused has furnished a bond of \$2000 to insure his attendance at the next circuit court.
