Senator Kuykendall is now canvassing the county for votes to place him in the senate for the next Oregon legislature. The gentleman is not a new man for that honorable position having served in that capacity during the last session of that extravagant body. Some weeks ago *The Leader* attacked Mr Kuykendall's record as senator for Lane Co, and charged that he was the champion of cheap Chinese and Japanese labor and as such was clearly the tool of corporations and an enemy of the laboring classes. The Senator after spitting out a few venomous flings and stabs at the *LEADER* in a three column article in the Eugene Register undertook the more difficult task of proving our assertions were false. Did he succeed? Let us see. The *LEADER* said "The Daily Oregonian of Jan 15 1901 said" Senator Kuykendall provoked a spirited debate by moving to strike out the sections (in the Memorial) extending the act to Japanese and other Mongolians on the plea that the Japanese were highly civilized. He further declared that he was personally opposed to all exclusion laws and that we (the Pacific Coast) needed cheap labor to develop our grand resources. These are the Oregonian's words not the *LEADER*'s. They were published at the time the memorial was up for discussion in the Senate. Now Mr Kuykendall becomes highly displeased at "the political strabismus" of the *Leader* and prates about its "periodical outbreaks of inveracity." He says no one "pretends or expects the *LEADER* to tell the truth" and that he would not have paid any attention to it had not what we said been published in the *Guard*. Of course we are glad the gentleman explained why he condescended to notice our few remarks and all that—but Mr Kuykendall will you be so kind as to say why you didn't call the Oregonian down when it made those statements. It was undoubtedly on your desk the very next morning you made that speech. It must have been at least fresh in your mind at that time. Do you also regard it as untruthful. Now the *LEADER* never charged the senator with voting against the memorial when up for final passage. But we did charge that he tried to kill the greater part of the bill and he admits that he did move to strike out 4 sections out of the 6 contained in the memorial. And we now

claim that the Senator is an enemy of American laborer and not only tried to strike out two-thirds of the bill but that he voted against the bill when his amendments failed to pass. For proof we offer the following statement from Senator Inman of Multnomah County who not only introduced the bill but who knew its enemies and its friends and watched every move during its consideration and passage.

PORTLAND, Oregon, May 5, 1902.  
TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:  
In regard to action of Senator Kuykendall upon the Memorial asking for the exclusion of Chinese and Japanese from the United States, will say that upon the 24th of January, 1901, in the Senate of Oregon, he voted against the Memorial. I neglected to call for the ayes and noes, but remember distinctly that he voted against the Memorial.

Now we do not charge Senator Kuykendall with insanity but he himself says in the letter to the Register that "no sane man with any political aspirations would get up on the floor of the Oregon Legislature and declare himself against the policy of the exclusion of the Chinese." If what he said was not a declaration against that policy we submit that the way he voted certainly did constitute such a declaration. Now our friend Kuykendall need not worry about the *LEADER*'s "responsibility" or the editors "strabismus" but he is up against both the Oregonian and Senator Inman, of Portland and other prominent men whose version of the affair the Senator says is false and not only this but Senator is up against the voters as well and they can figure out where the falsehood lies.

Again the gentlemen says "it is perhaps unfortunate for him that he is not the S P Railroad's physician for Lane Co" and then in the next breath says Dr Wall, Dr Lee, Dr Oug and Dr Paine and himself have the job between them. Now the *LEADER* did not say that the senator was the only employe and physician of the S P Co nor do we claim the fact that there are others, lessons the charge that he is an employe of the railroad company. In this the gentleman shows bad taste as well as childish foolishness.

No, No Mr K, we do not claim you are the "only thing" at all. Please don't lay that sin at our door. We know there are others and we know that you are also one of them and whether or not you use that pass or any other the company gives you makes no difference. The railroad company is not in the business of carrying people for nothing.

Again the senator begs the question when he intimates the *Leader* charged him with voting against the 3 cent per mile law. We didn't do it. We charge him with being a champion of the railroad company in preventing its passage. Perhaps he may ask for some testimony on that line to freshen his memory. If so we will try to accommodate him later.

He may call for evidence to refresh his mind as to why he voted to postpone indefinitely the Indian war veterans claim for the sum of \$30,000 as he seems a little confused in the reasons for that action we are ready and willing to say something in this line also.

Senator Kuykendall tries to hide behind republicanism in his defense and prates about what the party has stood for in the past. It is not a question of what his party stands for. It is a question of what and who he stands for. He heads the republican ticket in this county in name only. He is on the ticket because the Booth Kelly Co wanted him there. He is there because the Fulton Senatorial Boom has need of him. He's there because the bosses liked his record. But he is not there because the rank and file of republican party wanted him there. He will not stand by the rank and file of his party when they express their choice by ballot for the next

United States Senator in the person of Gov T T Geer. If any republican thinks he will, ask him and see if he won't dodge the question. He helped make the law that allows the people to record their choice for U S Senator. Just ask him if he will abide by the result and vote for Mr Geer should he be their choice. Ask him if he had a hand in sitting down on the Cottage Grove delegation at the county convention if he says no, ask him why his friends are so anxious to explain 'he didn't', and if he says yes, ask him who told him to do it. Mr Kuykendall is quite a smooth fellow, but the *LEADER* undertakes to say his "political strabismus" is such that the Booth Kelly Company and the Fulton Senatorial boom looks bigger to his eyes than the rank and file of the whole republican party, and their interests will be in a large measure lost sight of by Mr K when they come in conflict with the bosses that are in the saddle to day.

Hon Geo E Chamberlain is making the great extravagance practiced in the state offices so well known that the opposition are now referring to the expenditures in Washington (also controlled in every branch by republican) claiming them to be greater than those of Oregon. The figures given for Washington for the past two years are: \$2,374,724, while they claim Oregon was over \$500,000 less. Republicans are appealed to by the Oregonian and republican speakers generally to stand by the "republican party" and "vote straight" irrespective of who is on the ticket. Such appeals simply acknowledge the extreme weakness of the republican ticket. But we believe they can "vote with pride" to forever relegate to the rear some of these grafters and tools of corporations and bondholders.
