The past week has been unseasonable cool, and cold, local rains have occurred almost daily in the western part of the State, and showery conditions prevailed generally east of the Cascade mountains. A sharp frost occurred Monday morning in southern Oregon, and the indication were favorable for frost again on Tuesday morning, in all exposed localities, except near the coast.

Both fall and spring wheat continue to make satisfactory progress, except on low and poorly drained land in the Willamette valley, where the fall wheat keeps yellow and has a sickly appearance. It is thought now that some of this yellow wheat is unusually weedy. Fall rye and barley are beginning to head. Oats are doing nicely, and grass of all kinds is making a luxuriant growth.

Gardens are backward and very weedy. The cool, wet weather has retarded the growth of tender vegetables, but potatoes seems to be doing fairly well. Potatoes and corn planting is progressing as rapidly as possible, and the early planted fields have come up nicely. Hops are also in a promising condition and the vines now reach above the tops of the poles.
