### ST. PIERRE OBLITERATED.

Completely Covered With Lava.  
Ash Showers and Detona-  
tions Continue.

LONDON, May 27.—The Morning  
Post publishes a dispatch from the  
Island of St Lucia, dated May 24,  
which says that St Pierre is now  
completely covered with lava, and  
that it will be dangerous to approach  
the place until the covering hardens.  
Ash showers and detonations con-  
tinue, says the dispatch. Fort de  
France, according to the Post's cor-  
respondent, is safe, but the people  
are apprehensive lest the lightning  
flashes shall fire the hundreds of  
tons of explosive stored in the forts.  
The inhabitants are fleeing. Two  
hundred of them arrived here yester-  
day and 17,000 of them are on the  
Island of Guadeloupe. Most of  
them all destitute.

[As Mt Pelee is on the extreme  
northern projection of Martinique,  
and the island is forty-three miles  
long. The fear and terror of the  
inhabitants may be imagined  
through the hurried departure of  
near twenty thousand people out of  
a total population of less than two  
hundred thousand.—Editor.]
