The Quarterly of the Oregon Historical Society for March 1901, has been received. Its contents are as follows:

"The Social Evolution of Oregon," by Prof J R Robertson, of the chair of History, Pacific University, Forest Grove; "Political History of Oregon from 1865 to 1876," by Hon W D Fenton, Portland; "History of the Barlow Road," by Miss Mary S Barlow, a grand daughter of Samuel Lambrough Barlow, the builder; "Across the Continent Seventy Years Ago," compiled from papers of John Ball by his daughter, Mrs Kate N B Powers. John Ball taught a school at Vancouver in November, 1832, and was the first school teacher on the Pacific coast. All these articles are vitally important as relative to the history of Oregon.

Parents who send small children to the public schools will appreciate the position taken by W A Wann, Democratic candidate for Superintendent of Public Instructions. Mr Wann announces himself as strongly opposed to "cramping" the infantile brain until the child is almost ready for the insane asylum. The thought of pupils being compelled to work all day and study at home at night is so obnoxious to the gentleman that he announces this as one of the changes that should obtain in the schoolrooms of Oregon.
