## THE BOHEMIA RAILROAD.

Track Being Laid.--Bridge Gang at Work. Grading Progressing Nicely.

The work on the Oregon and South Eastern railroad from Cottage Grove to Bohemia is progressing rapidly. Connection has been made with the S P Co's line about 300 yards south of the depot and track is being laid from that point. Sunday morning a number of cars loaded with rails, ties and bridge timbers were set out on the new track. The bridge carpenters are busy framing the timbers in the yard. The grading gangs are getting along rapidly with the work. The grade has been practically completed from town out to the Mosby Creek bridge a distance of about 4 miles, and at the rate work is now progressing this end of the road will be ready for rolling stock soon.

According to figures received by The Oregonian up to 2 o'clock, June 5th Chamberlain leads Furnish for Governor by but 10 votes. But complete returns of the vote for Governor have been received from only nine counties in the state, and no figures at all have been reported from four of the more remote counties. From 23 of the counties the reports are more or less incomplete.

## CHAMBERLAIN WINS.

A Victory for Reform Forces in Oregon.

BOODLES WILL HAVE TO TAKE A BACK SEAT FOR FOUR YEARS MORE.

While the returns from the outlying districts are as yet incomplete, enough is known to insure the election of Geo E Chamberlain as governor of Oregon. The republicans generally concede his election over Furnish by small pluralities varying from 300 to 500. Umatilla, Mr Furnish's own home came near being the Banner Chamberlain county giving him 599 majority over the ex-democratic sheriff. Baker and Multnomah and Union alone giving larger majorities for the democratic candidate.

Both Tongue and Williamson are elected by heavy majorities, as was the remainder of the state republican ticket. The Legislature has a working majority for the republicans and will elect a republican U S Senator. Though democrats made substantial gains in the legislature both branches will remain with the republicans in control.

The following is the vote by counties on the governor so far as returns are in.

## THE COUNTY ELECTION

Returns From All But Six Precincts In.

WITHERS THE ONLY DEMOCRAT.

Unofficial returns from all but six of the precincts of the county are in. These precincts are: Five Rivers, Florence, Hermann, Heceta, Middle Fork and McKinzie.

The returns show that the entire Republican ticket except Withers sheriff, was elected. Withers goes in with 700 or 800 majority. He is a hard man to beat.

Kuykendall is elected senator over Travis by about 150, and Burton assessor over Kitchen by about 60. All the other Republicans have the usual majority, Leo, clerk, and Harris, representative, running ahead of the ticket, however.

Hale received the highest vote of the three Democratic nominees for representative.

## PEACE DECLARED IN SOUTH AFRICA.

Great Britain and the Boers Stop their Long Fight.

LONDON, June 2.--Peace has been declared after nearly two years and eight months of a war which tried the British empire to its uttermost and wiped the Boers from the list of nations.

The war has come to an end with Lord Kitchener's announcement from Pretoria that he, Lord Milner and the Boer delegates had signed "terms of surrender." This announcement had been anticipated for several days, and it was definitely forecasted in these dispatches, but its receipt Sunday afternoon took the nation by surprise, as everybody had confidently believed that the House of Commons would hear the first news today. The edge of the anticipation with which Great Britain awaited the promised statement in the House of Commons from Mr Balfour, the government leader, was still further dulled by the following message from King Edward to his people, which was issued after midnight:

"The King has received the welcome news of the cessation of hostilities in South Africa with infinite satisfaction, and His Majesty trusts that peace may speedily be followed by the restoration of prosperity in his new dominions, and that the feelings necessarily engendered by war will give place to earnest co-operation on the part of His Majesty's South African subjects in promoting the welfare of their common country."

How greatly King Edward's insistence that peace in South Africa be secured prior to his inauguration influenced the present agreement will probably not be known until the private memoirs of the present regime are given to the public.

The news which Great Britain was so anxiously awaiting came characteristically on an entirely pacific and uninteresting Sunday afternoon, when London presents a deserted appearance. Very late Saturday night a dispatch was received from Lord Kitchener, in which he said the Boer delegates were coming to Pretoria, that they had accepted Great Britain's terms and they were prepared to sign terms of surrender. Mr Brodrick, the War Secretary, personally communicated this message to King Edward, who was at Buckingham Palace. But the government declined to take any chances and nothing concerning the receipt of this message was allowed to leak out. At about 1 o'clock yesterday afternoon the War Office received the following dispatch from Lord Kitchener, dated Pretoria, Saturday, May 31, 11:15 p m:

"A document concerning terms of surrender was signed here this evening at 10:30 o'clock by all the Boers representative, as well as by Lord Milner and myself."
