VERY INTERESTING FIGURES

Congressman Benton of Missouri has been investigating the appropriation figures and he discovers that while both sessions of the Fifty-third congress appropriated \$916,013,523, during the single session of the Fifty seventh congress the appropriations amounted to \$1,059,577,052. Does it not seem reasonable that Mr Benton has good grounds for the charge that the republican party "prefers to expend in needless the wasteful appropriations the taxes wrung from the people."

Some one has asked whether it is true that the republicans have proposed a constitutional amendment on the trust question? Yes. Just before the campaign of 1900 they proposed a constitutional amendment ostensibly for the purpose of destroying the trusts, but really for the purpose of taking from the states the power which they now have. The democrats opposed the amendment because it was in the interests of the trusts rather than against them. They joined, however, in an anti-trust bill proposed by the republicans immediately afterwards, but when the election was over the bill died in the senate would not pass an anti-trust bill which was supported almost unanimously in the house, what reason is there to be believed that they would favor any amendment to the constitution that was really intended to hurt the trusts?

CROP BULLETIN

One of the severest windstorms ever known at this season of the year swept across the entire State on the afternoon of the night of the 14th. Ripe grain, fruit, hops and cut hay were badly damaged by the wind in many sections. Barley, being farther alone, suffered the most, and the yield will be considerable lessened from this cause. The damage to wheat was not so great, owing to the fact that much of it was too green to be badly shattered, although the green wheat was knocked down, the heads whipped off and the straw broken in numerous exposed places in different parts of the State.

Fruit also suffered quite extensively; many apples were blown off the trees and even the trees themselves were in some cases blown down. The damage to fruit was greatest in the Willamette valley and the coast countries. The laterals to the hop vines were torn away and in the more exposed yards the poles were blown down. In the case of cut hay; the stacks were blown down and the loose hay was scattered over the fields. Most of it was later recovered in fairly good condition and the damage to the hay crop by the windstorm did not amount to much.

The hot weather during the last few days of the week dried up pastures, and feed on the foothills is fast becoming poor. Stock, however, continue in good condition and the flow of milk in the dairy district has not shrunk more than usual at this season of the year. Haying is nearly finished, and some have begun cutting alfalfa. The hay crop is an average one and it has generally been secured in good condition.

The fall grain harvest has begun, and the cutting of grain will become general all over the State by the first of next week. Corn, potatoes, hops and gardens are growing nicely and the warm weather was just what these crops needed for rapid advancement.
