MISSING SCHOOL TEACHER.

WASHINGTON, July 24.—The war department today received a cablegram from Manila announcing that John Wells and Louis Thomas, of Providence, R I; Earnest Nager, of Cincinnati, and Clyde France, of Berea, Ohio, the school teachers who have been missing in Cebu, were murdered by Ladrones, and their bodies recovered. The leaders of the murderers were killed, and eight others were captured.

BIG CAVE-IN

AT LUCKY BOY

Miners from the Blue River district arrived in Eugene Monday with the information that a big cave-in happened at the Lucky Boy mines on Saturday afternoon.

For months the miners have been engaged in "stoping" in one of the main tunnels until it had reached the mammoth proportions of four hundred feet long by two hundred feet high. To the trained eyes of the scores of men engaged in gouging out the shining metal the walls rising on all sides like a gigantic amphitheatre, looked unsafe and they communicated their fears to the mine owners. An adjournment from the tunnel was taken at 11 o'clock a m last Saturday. After a consultation in the open air, a committee of the most expert decided to return for a more critical examination of the interior. They had no more than entered the tunnel when there was a deafening roar and with a crash the whole tunnel collapsed. The concussion of air, caused from the rear of the tunnel collapsing first, blew the men out of its mouth with the force of a catapult. This circumstance undoubtedly saved their lives. None were seriously hurt although all somewhat bruised.

The tunnel is now a mass of debris, many feet deep, with the main ledge standing out from the ruins, like a glittering statue.

Operations of the mill are now suspended until some course of action can be determined upon. In the meantime a cleanup of the ore now on hand is being made.
