WADE MARTIN

DIES AT THE ASYLUM.

EUGENE, Aug 4.—Word was received in Eugene Monday morning that Wade Martin, of Pleasant Hill, who was taken to the insane asylum at Salem Sunday, had died in that institution last night.

About five o'clock Sunday morning Sheriff Withers received a telephone message from Pleasant Hill requesting him to go to that place and arrest Martin, who had been suddenly attacked with a violent fit of insanity. He began running around the place in his night clothes shouting and gesticulating, badly frightening his family and neighbors. When Sheriff Withers arrived there it was with great difficulty that he got him in the vehicle. He brought him to Eugene and when he was placed in the county jail he fought the officers and when locked up his ravings could be heard for blocks. He was taken to Salem in the afternoon by Sheriff Withers and Ganey Mathews. Mr Withers says Martin's was the worst case of insanity he ever seen.
