I am instructed by Dr Calbreath to write you with regard to the sudden and unexpected death of your husband of which we telegraphed you this morning.

Mr Settle has been getting along nicely, having improved very much mentally, and in fact last evening appeared to be almost perfectly rational though he complained of feeling weak physically. He however stated he was feeling better in that regard, as he had been sick for sometime.

This morning at 5:30 when he was called by his attendant he got up and dressed and appeared to be as well as he had on retiring the evening before.

He started to go to the bathroom to wash, where he sank down upon the floor and died almost immediately. The cause of his death was evidently a weak heart which had given out under the strain of his recent troubles. We have telegraphed his brother at Lorane.
