LABOR DAY, 1902.

A Proclamation By the Governor.

Whereas, the Legislature of Oregon has set apart the first Monday in September of each year as a legal holiday to be known as Labor Day;

Therefore, I, T. T. Geer, Governor of said State, do hereby recommend that all places of business of whatsoever kind, as far as possible, be closed Monday, September 1, 1902, and that the day be devoted to an observance of such exercises as may contribute to a better understanding between Labor and Capital, the great moving forces behind modern industrial development, and it is especially urged that employers co-operate with their employees in a mutual observance of that day in such a manner as will fittingly recognize the reliance which each must place upon the best results from both may be expected or attained.

In Testimony Whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State to be affixed hereto.

Done at the Capitol, in the City of Salem, this thirteenth day of August, A D 1902.

THE COOS BAY-SALT LAKE RAILROAD.

The Oregonian of Aug 14th says. Chief Engineer Kinney, of the Great Central Railroad, last night gave out the statement that the transcontinental feature of the Coos Bay Railroad has been accepted and he had been directed to make location of the line through to Salt Lake City. This acceptance, he said, for bonding the road at \$16,000 a mile, involving the round number \$15,000,000, through the exact distance between Coos Bay and Salt Lake City over the new route has not yet been determined.

"Who is it that will do all this? Whose money, or what railroad is supporting your project?"

"Well to tell you the candid truth I don't know," he responded. "And what is more, I don't know as I care much. I do know that I am employed by a responsible people who are advancing all the money necessary in the preliminary operations; that we are paying promptly for what we buy, and will continue to do so. I know that I have been instructed to proceed with all possible speed to make the definite location of the line through between Coos Bay and Salt Lake City, and that I shall do my best to obey instructions."

"The preliminary work will take three months at least, so I do not look for active constructions to begin on the line before next spring. That is, on the main line. Work on the Belt line Railway at Coos Bay will not be delayed for that however."

MANILA, Aug. 18.—The Moros in Mindanao are renewing their attacks upon the outposts and pack-trains of the American column at Lake Lanao, which is under the command of Captain J J Pershing, of the Fifteenth Cavalry. The Americans have successfully repulsed the Moro attacks and have suffered no losses. The commander of the American forces in Mindanao report aggressive action against the Moros to be necessary and ask permission to move against Bacalod and other strongholds of the hostile Mohammedans. There are about 2000 American soldiers in Mindanao available for the desired aggressive movement. It is believed this number is sufficient to defeat the Moros, although it would possibly be necessary to strengthen their base before undertaking the movement.
