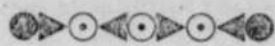

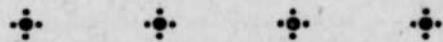

### Waived His Examination.

#### Lyons Hears the Complaint Read to Him in Jail and Will Wait Trial in March.

E E Lyons was aroused from his couch in the county jail Wednesday morning by District Attorney Geo Brown, and listened to the complaint charging him with murder in the first degree, as a result of a bullet fired from a pistol in the hands of the accused.

He listened attentively to the reading and when asked his pleading said he would waive his examination and come to trial next month.

Circuit Court convenes the first Monday in March, two weeks only from Monday next. Lyons will then answer the charge and be sentenced to be hanged to expiate his crime.

The prisoner shows signs of worry and the strain he is put under. Some of the officials think he will completely collapse.

#### Charred Remains of Little One.

A most startling accident happened about four miles north of Drain, Friday afternoon. A man named Gibbs, who recently came into that neighborhood, with his wife and little girl about three years of age, moved into a house on the mountain about a mile and a half east of the Estes place. At the time above mentioned the man and wife left the child in the house asleep, and went down the mountain to the Estes place, and were gone about two hours. On returning they found the house in ashes, and the charred remains of their little one among the ruins.

The father of the little girl was in this office yesterday and says the report that they left the fire burning was untrue as they thought they were careful to put out every spark of fire before leaving and that it was usual for the little one to sleep the greater part of the afternoon and he took his wife along for a walk as she had been closely confined for a long while and needed a little recreation. That the parents are terribly grief stricken over their misfortune and will never forgive themselves for their fatal mistake cannot be doubted.

### LYONS CAPTURED.

#### Disguised as a Tramp

#### He Tries to Board a Freight Train.

While Marshall Underwood and a large posse of armed men were guarding the different roads leading to and from this place Monday in a down pour of rain anticipating the capture of Murderer Lyons a few men at Creswell were successful in bagging the game. The outlaw came through Creswell about 8:30 a m disguised as a tramp. He was recognized by Edgar Parsons and a posse of 5 or 6 men was hastily organized and jumped into the wagon of I H Veatch and immediately gave chase. In the mean time the south bound freight train crew hearing the supposed murderer was speeding up the track pulled out and when in sight of the outlaw slowed up the train when Lyons attempted to board the train conductor R E Veatch ejected him from the train just as the posse arrived on the scene when they covered the outlaw with their guns and it was all up with the slayer of sheriff Withers. Not being armed the capture was made without any trouble whatever and was hastily taken in private conveyance to Eugene where Sheriff Fisk soon had the miserable wretch behind the bars and safe from the vengeance of any prospective mob.

On the way down to Eugene he talked to his captors about the shooting. He said that he had made up his mind that the first man who drew his gun on him was going to get shot. "And Withers was the man" said Lyons. He stated that his wife did not have hold of the sheriff when he was shot but that she was holding him (Lyons.)

Lyons told his captors that he had concluded to play the hobo and light out for California. Accordingly he entered Eugene early Sunday night, and said he stopped at the house opposite Frazer's iron works, on East Eighth street, changed his clothes and went on up to Goshen, near which place he spent the remainder of the night under a pile of ties along side the railroad. He said that he was held up two or three times in and near Eugene on his way through the city but as he was not armed and appeared to be an innocent tramp with a pack was unmolested.

STATE HOUSE, Salem Feb 11.—Governor Chamberlain returned the bill providing for the garnishment of the salaries of state employes to the house, where it originated, today, with his veto.

Governor Chamberlain pointed out that the intended law was class legislation in that it provided the manner of collection or liabilities from the state only it not being applicable to any other persons than those in in the employment of the state.

The vote was sustained.
