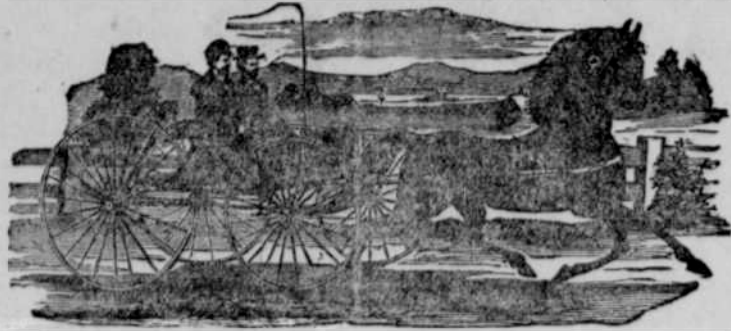

Erysipelas—Try carbolic acid, tincture of iodine, alcoholis—one-half dram each; oil of terebinthinae one dram and glycerine one-half dram. Use as an external application only. Every two hours the erysipelatous part may be painted with this liquid as well as a small zone of the surrounding healthy tissues and the whole covered with aseptic gauze.

Throat Wash—The swallowing of mucus during the night in bronchitis and catarrh often causes a disinclination for food in the morning. An alkaline solution of common salt, made by dissolving ten grains each of sodium chloride and sodium bicarbonate in a bouillon cup of very hot water should be taken half an hour before breakfast for its cleansing effect.

Pulmonary Complaints—Ichthyol has frequently been employed in the treatment of pulmonary tuberculosis with gratifying results. Administer it diluted with an equal quantity of water in doses of five to twenty drops three daily in wine or black coffee as a vehicle after meals. Ichthyol is perfectly non-toxic and is not injurious to the digestive organs. The appetite is likely improved under the use of this remedy. Annoying night-sweats are relieved, the cough quieted and fever reduced. Ichthyol may be recommended as an efficient substitute for creosote and its derivatives in the treatment of pulmonary tuberculosis.
