"Just thought I'd stop while I was up here," he said, "to see if you wanted to take out a little insurance."

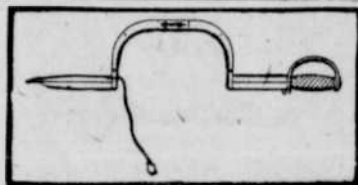
"I got notings to insure," said the farmer—"notings but my wife."
