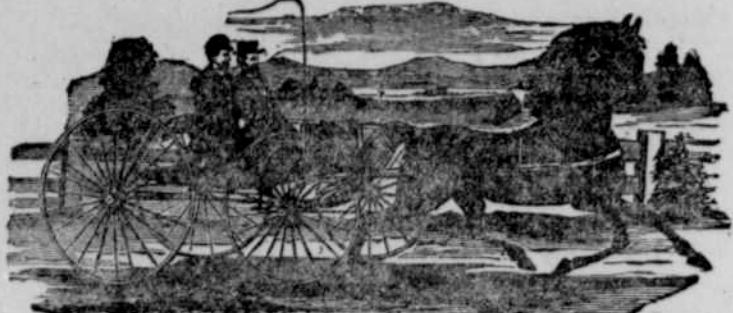

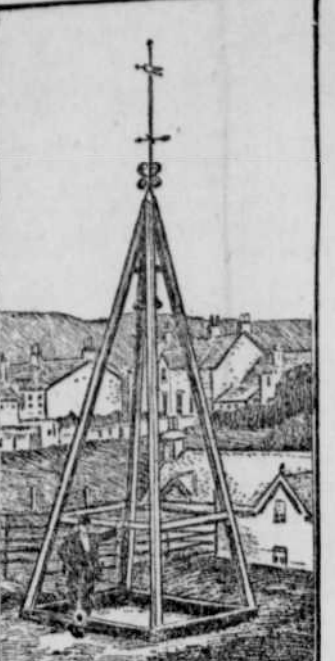

A CURFEW WHICH RINGS IN SCOTLAND



At Leadhills village, in the mountain district of Scotland, less than two hours' ride from Glasgow, may be seen the curfew bell herewith illustrated. This bell is not only interesting by reason of tradition, but because it is still in use. Clocks in the neighborhood are set by it, and when there is any question about the accuracy of a timepiece the good housewife is apt to declare with conviction that the clock is right, for it has been "with the curfew on the minute every night for a month." The people of Leadhills would naturally be expected to hang on to time-worn customs, for they are almost as primitive as their ancestors of two centuries ago. Their sole occupation is mining lead for the benefit of the Earl of Hopetoun and the Duke of Buccleuch, lords of the manor.

FOR ORPHANS OF MASONS.
Girls' Home to Be Erected in Philadelphia at a Cost of \$500,000.
Work is soon to begin in Philadelphia on the erection of a home for the orphan girls of Masons, at a cost of \$500,000. The donor is William L. Elkins, a wealthy Philadelphian and prominent in Masonic circles. The building, which is to be erected on North Broad street, on a lot 450 feet square, will be of red brick and white marble in the Georgian style. It will house 100 girls, and the girls are to be educated thoroughly, and are also to be taught trades—such trades as millinery, bookkeeping, dressmaking, stenography, cooking, etc.—so that they may secure lucrative work readily. Features of the home will be a large and well-equipped gymnasium in the basement, two isolated wards for hospital purposes and a graded system of dormitories—a system whereby the smaller girls, arranged according to their ages, will sleep in rooms holding from eight to twelve persons, while the older girls will each have a separate room.

HONORED BY ROOSEVELT.

Negro Who Has Been Made Assistant Federal Attorney in Boston.
Among the recent appointments of negroes to Federal offices made by President Roosevelt is that of William H. Lewis, of Boston, to the position of United States attorney in the modern Athens. Mr. Lewis is a graduate of Amherst College, and of the law department of Harvard University. Two years ago he was elected a member of the Massachusetts legislature from a Cambridge district. Mr. Lewis was born in 1868 at Berkeley, Va., and was fitted for college at Petersburg. He was distinguished for his scholarship at Amherst, and also for his ability as a football player. He won the Harvard prizes in debate and in oratory, and in Harvard he was regarded as one of the best football players the university ever had. In 1895 he was admitted to the bar and soon built up a good practice in Cambridge. He was induced by his friends to run for the Legislature, and was elected by a big majority.

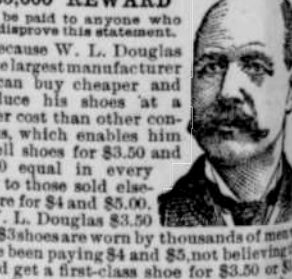
