# CLOTHING INDIANS.

**Old Age, Had Something to Top This Death.**  
A report from an isolated region of Mexico says Yuma, Ariz., tells of the death of an Indian, Tar Head, who through his life was considered the ugliest man of the Yuma Indian nation. His death is attributed to the custom of taking up late in life the wearing of white men's clothing. Since the tribe adopted the wearing apparel of the whites, Tar Head, ears ago, disease has carried off many of its members.

Tar Head, typical of the physical development of his tribe and was more than five feet tall. He was chief of the Yuma band of Indian couriers who played greater endurance in traveling the ponies of other Indian tribes.

Across the desert of the great American desert runners, stimulated simply by the fact of carrying in their mouths, covered with a few miles in a tireless dog trot. Many stories are told of the endurance of these couriers. A hundred mile day is said to be a comparatively easy feat for a Yuma runner to undertake.

Tar Head, made himself a hero in the eyes of Uncle Sam's soldiers, when, during the Apache troubles, he saved the garrison of Yuma in the territory of Arizona by conveying a message to Phoenix, which called for reinforcements. The distance covered by him between sunrise and sunset exceeded 150 miles.

He rested for a night at Phoenix, and, starting out afoot on the following morning, led the cavalry back to Yuma before darkness. The cavalry horses were jaded and a few of them were unable to complete the journey, but Tar Head, who preceded the rescuing party afoot, displayed few signs of fatigue.
