The snag boat is now working between this city and Harrisburg. Capt. Hatch will soon have the upper river in good shape for navigation.

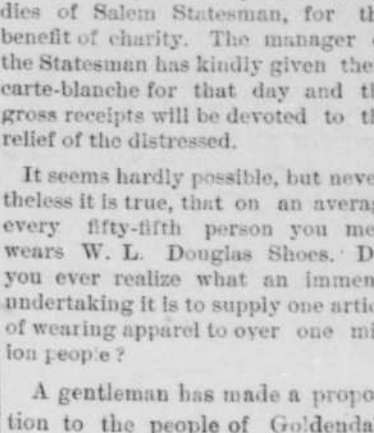
The city of Pendleton during '94 received into the treasury \$5000 more than it expended. That is a good showing in a dull year, and one which should be repeated in 1895.
