OBJECTS.

Two complete Courses of Study, the Classical and the Scientific, have been arranged, embracing together Mathematics, Ancient and Modern Languages, English, Science, Art, Music, Bible, Book-keeping, Theory and Practice of Teaching, History, etc., and students, by the advice and consent of the Faculty, can pursue those studies shown to be most advantageous to them. After the close of the regular Session, a Normal class will be formed and taught by two of the Professors for the benefit of those who desire to pass examination before some County Board for Teachers' certificates.
