Bro. John Daley was born Friday, Dec. 2, 1808, in Marsellas, Onondaga Co., New York. He went to Ohio in the spring of 1824, was married to Miss Livona Carter Nov. 28, 1832, in Florence, Huron Co., Ohio. He became a member of the Church of Christ when in his 22nd year, and has lived an honorable member of the church until his death, which occurred at his residence, in Eagle Point, Jackson Co., Oregon, at 20 minutes before 5 o'clock, July 10, 1883; aged 74 years, 7 months and 8 days; had been a Christian for over 54 years, and he and Sister Daley, who now survives him, had journeyed side by side through life for over a half century. For the past 5 years he had suffered with dropsy and for near a year has suffered intensely; but for his last moments his sufferings troubled him not, and when life's flickering light was extinguished he was as an infant going into a calm sleep, upon its mother's bosom. He with his family moved from Ohio to Illinois in autumn of 1849. He settled in Dixon, where he built and run a flouring mill. In the spring of 1864 he with his family and others crossed the plains from Ills. to Salem Oregon, where he remained until the spring of 1870. Then came to this county and in Ashland was employed as the leading workman in building the woolen factory and fitting it up and running it for a time. In April of 1872 he, in partnership with Bro. E. Emery, commenced building the flouring mill at Eagle Point which was completed during that summer and in the fall he with his partner and his son, A. J. Daley, commenced operating this mill, which occupied his time until his failing health compelled him to turn his business over to his son, A. J. D. His life has been full of business and energy. He has been loved and respected by all who knew him. His body was confined to mother earth in the beautiful cemetery near Ashland, this county, on the 11th of July, 1883, amid sorrowing relatives and friends. But we sorrow not as those without hope, but believe those who sleep in Jesus, God will bring with him.
