**Taking his chance** 

Senior ready for next step

DALLAS — Dallas pitcher Logan Hatley's high school career didn't end the way he had hoped.

But his journey made him the Dragons' top starter for the second season in a row. Hatley went 6-2 on the pitcher's mound. He gave up just 10 earned runs for a 1.19 ERA, the lowest among the Dragons' starters. He also gave up just 38 hits, holding opponents to batting .182. Hatley also led Dallas with 102 strikeouts and was named the Mid-Willamette Conference's Pitcher of the Year for the secondstraight season.

It's all these accomplishments that makes Hatley the Itemizer-Observer's Player of the Year for the 2015 season.

While Hatley's high school career may be finished, he's hoping this is just the beginning of something special.

From the moment he played T-ball, there was little question what sport was Hatley's favorite. Yet, as he turned 10 and players began settling in posi-

tions, Hatley felt unhappy with his role. See HATLEY, Page 11A


