Megan Bever, a technical assistant with the city of Dallas, said it took until the last step before a buffer zone was mowed in late June to meet the agricultural standard.

She said the property is in compliance, though she understands residents' concerns because the field runs right up to backyard fences.

Dallas Fire & EMS spokeswoman April Welsh also believes the situation is worrisome.

Dallas Fire has been a source of frustration for Ceres Gleann residents due to what they feel is a lack of response to their complaints. Welsh said that the fire department can't address the problem on its own.

"We don't have any control over what people do with their properties," she said.

She added there are plenty of properties that could pose a problem that she wishes the fire depart-

They lived a short time in Salem but returned to Dallas to make their home. She worked in the canneries and at the Neufeld prune drier.


Leta was the spiritual leader of the family and could be found reading her Bible and listening to gospel music. She was a member of the Dallas First Christian Church.
