She was preceded in death by her husband, Fred on Dec. 23, 1978; sons, Kendall and Donald Robinson; brother, Eugene McDonald; sister, MaRea McDonald; and nephew, Harry McDonald.

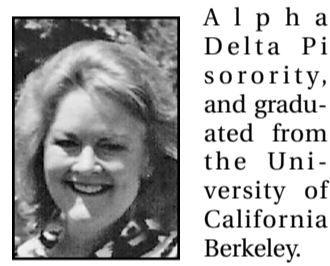

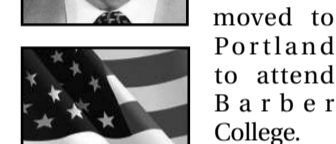
