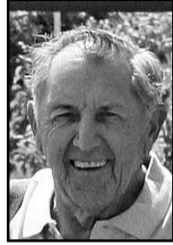

journeyman machinist. This is when he met Kathleen Riordan "Kay."

They were married after a brief courtship on Nov. 17, 1956, and moved from their small apartment to a home they purchased in Tualatin.

For the last 50 years, they have lived on the farm in the Eola Hills in West Salem. They raised sheep, grain crops, and Christmas trees and managed a stand of timber on the 345-acre property.

In addition to farming, Bob loved tending to his timber. He was a volunteer for the Oregon State University Extension Service as a master woodland manager. He was an avid hunter and fisherman and enjoyed camping, gardening, restoring his old tractors and spending his winters in sunny Arizona.
