The local neighbors plan to capture and move several birds (including the adolescents pictured in your article) when the adult males lose their tales and become transportable, about the beginning of July.

The remaining birds will be less likely to roam onto nearby properties and roads.

These are beautiful birds and often on display on the neighborhood streets. They also seem to realize they are photogenic.

Just a warning though: they are wild birds. They're not aggressive but they are not chummy either. So watch with care.
