Tom enjoyed hunting, fishing, camping, as well as gardening. Tom was an avid Oregon State Beaver football fan. He has attended games for many many years.

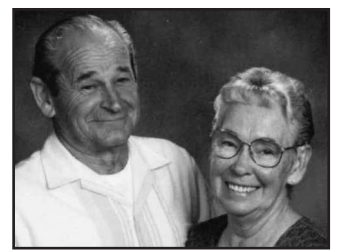

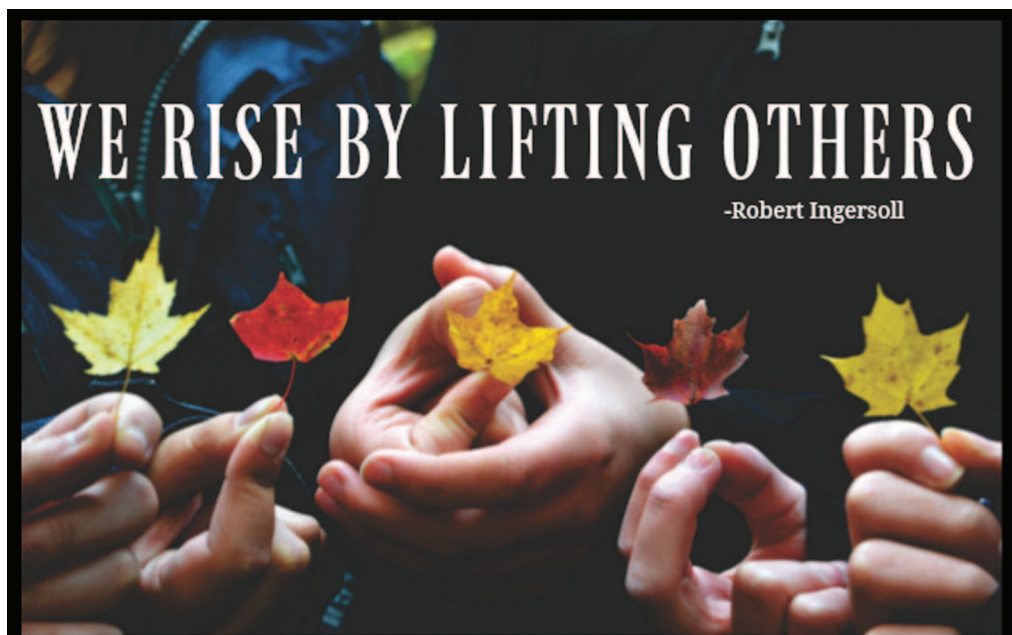
