

Wrestling expectations

DALLAS — Dallas' wrestling program has a history of excellence, and so far, the Dragons have lived up to that history.

Dallas dominated the Brunner Invitational, placing first out of eight teams on Saturday.

"It's awesome to get to wrestle in front of the community," senior Treve Earhart said. "For all our friends and families to not have to travel far to watch us, it's great and it's always good to win in front of the

home crowd."

The Dragons went 4-0, defeating Junction City (67-9), Willamina (58-7) and Pendleton (65-6) before beating Milwaukie (60-6) in the first-place match.

Dallas' finish on Saturday was the latest in a string of strong results to start the season.

The Dragons are ranked third in Class 5A by the Oregon Wrestling Forum.

Senior Treve Earhart is off to a 22-3 start, including three wins on Saturday, and is ranked first in 5A at 182 pounds by the OWF. See DALLAS, Page 11A
