We have wasted a good deal of sympathy on the Circassian girls who are sold to the highest bidder in the Turkish slave market. They have been brought up with an eye to this fate from babyhood. They are expected to make the family fortune; are given the daintiest food, and their health and beauty are matters of constant solicitude. Warm, perfumed baths and silken clothing keep their skins soft and fresh, and they are allowed to do no work. The rest of the family usually fare hard, eat coarse food, and do rough labor.

When the future slave girl has reached budding womanhood she is disposed of to a dealer in slaves, who lets his best customers know that he possesses a treasure almost priceless, and all her virtues and beauties are detailed with the usual Oriental exaggeration. Finally some royal Princess or rich Pasha's wife expresses a wish to see her, and extra care having been taken with her bath and dress, she is presented for inspection. From long preparation and jealous guarding from the sun she has a skin white as milk, and her naturally beautiful type of face is adorned with the usual tints of kohl to the eyebrows and eyelashes and rogue to the full red lips. Her exquisitely shaped nails glow with henna, and her own luxuriant hair is intertwined with meshes of silk (for • the prophet curses women who join their hair to that of another) till it reaches her ankles in an uneven number of tails, an even number being for-

· She gives samples of her accomplishments, musical, gymnastic and otherwise. Accepted, she is at once clothed with a rich silk dress, and receives a present of a necklace or bracelet as an earnest of favor before she joins her fellow slaves. Beyond assisting her mistress in the toilet, accompanying her in her drives, and handing her coffee and cigarettes, she has little to do. She is an ornamental appendage rather than a servant. When the time comes for her to be married her owner chooses a suitable husband and gives a rich dower, and many of the marriages of slave girls eclipse in magnificence even those of the wealthier classes.

The erstwhile barefooted, ragged little Circassian from Turcoman's land is now a princess or Pasha's wife with slaves of her own; but she would laugh if you suggested to her that there was any thing degrading in their position or had been in her own. The degradation and the hardship are simple ideas formed in ignorance of the facts and conditions of Oriental domestic life and have no place to reality. Of course there is another side to the picture, but even that is not a dark one. The girl may fall under the displeasure of the master or mistress and will then get punished. The writer has known many cases of older horses being rendered practically worthless by coming in contact with the barbed wire fence. Often, too, during the spring, a young colt is crowded against the wire by the older animals. Ninetenths of the cases can be avoided by simply plowing several furrows on either side of the fence in fall. It will take but a short-time and will give the animals a chance to protect themselves. When once accustomed to the furrog they will always afterward associate the barbed fence with the furrow, told guard against it.
