HERMANN IS CHOSEN.

Douglas County Statesman Named for Congress on Twenty-Third Ballot.

On the twenty-third announced ballot, within twenty minutes o midnight, Binger Hermann, o Douglas county was nominated for Congress after a most spirited and prolonged contest, lasting all the afternoon from 2:30 and all the evening without intermission for supper.
