

NO PANIC IN THE WEST

"Plenty of Money and Plenty of Common Sense," Says Governor Odell.

A dispatch to the Record-Herald from Mohawk Lake, N. Y., says: Governor Odell, who has just returned from a tour of the West, says the people outside of Wall street are too busy with big crops and other business to pay any attention to the recent flurry and failures.

"There is no sign of panic anywhere except in the East," he says. "In the West there is plenty of money and plenty of common sense. Business is good, crops are abundant and money cheap everywhere I have been. The excitement and demoralization of the East are regarded with indifference in the great, busy productive, West," he continued.

"Of course I found labor strikes in the West as in the East, but they were strikes for higher wages and shorter hours, not strikes against lower wages, which are signs of bad times. That is a very important fact to remember just now.'
